Re: Application of the Brown Act to the BCC TAC

You recently asked me whether the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) to the Sacramento Valley Basinwide Air Pollution Control Council (BCC) is subject to the requirements of the Brown Act. The short answer, explained in more detail below, is yes. Consequently, the TAC must comply with all requirements of the Act, including public noticing, agenda, and open meeting requirements.

Any body created by state or federal law is a public agency and subject to the Brown Act. (Cal. Govt. Code §54952(a).) In addition, any committee of a local agency created by resolution or other formal action of the agency is also subject to the Brown Act. (§ 54952(b).) Generally, this is the case regardless of whether the body is permanent or temporary, advisory or decision-making. The most commonly known example of these subsidiary bodies may be planning commissions, which are comprised of unelected officials appointed by city councils with specific land use jurisdiction and are therefore required to meet the Brown Act requirements.

There is a specific exemption to this general rule for an advisory committee that includes less than a quorum of the members of the appointing legislative body. (§ 54952(b).) But there is also an exception to the exemption; specifically, the exemption does not apply if the advisory committee is a standing committee. (§ 54952(b).) A standing committee is a committee that has continuing jurisdiction over a particular subject matter (e.g., budget, finance, legislation) or whose meeting schedule is set by the legislative body that created it.

The BCC is a public agency created by statute and must comply with the Brown Act. (Health and Safety Code § 40900.) It formally created a subsidiary body, the TAC, through the adoption of its bylaws. (BCC Bylaws, Article VIII.) These bylaws also state that the purpose of the TAC is to "carry out the duties assigned by the BCC concerning technical, enforcement and planning processes, and take other actions necessary to advise the BCC on all aspects of air pollution control efforts in the Sacramento Valley Air Basin." (Article VIII, § A.) Since it has continuing jurisdiction to advise the BCC on air pollution issues, the TAC is a standing committee. The TAC also qualifies as a standing committee on the separate grounds that its meeting schedule was set by the BCC, whose bylaws established a monthly meeting schedule unless meetings are cancelled by the TAC Chair. (Article VIII, § C.) Consequently, the TAC must also comply with the Brown Act.

Prior to drafting this memo, this issue and determination were circulated to the district counsels for the other agencies in the BCC and no objections were received.
